OVERVIEW

ADMISSION FEES

Your general admission to the Cincinnati Art Museum is free every day. This is made possible by a generous gift from The Richard and Lois Rosenthal Foundation. Free admission on Saturday is made possible by The Thomas J. Emery Free Day Endowment established by Mary Emery in 1906. Free general admission for children is made possible in part through an endowment established by the Cincinnati Financial Corporation/The Cincinnati Insurance Companies. There are charges for certain educational programs.

SPECIAL EXHIBITION TICKET FEES

Pricing may vary. Individual Members receive 1 Free Ticket to our Special Exhibitions. Family Members and above receive 2 Free Tickets our Special Exhibitions.

PARKING

Parking is FREE in Museum lots; Museum members have the benefit of preferred parking.

TOURS

Meet in the lobby for a free public tour weekdays at 1 p.m., Saturdays at 1 and 2 p.m., and Sundays at 1, 2, and 3 p.m. You can also pick up a Family Fun Guide at the Visitor Services Desk. If you wish to attend a tour for a special exhibition, you may need to purchase a ticket.

PHOTOGRAPHIC CONSENT

The Cincinnati Art Museum may photograph or videotape visitors for educational and marketing purposes. Attendance on CAM property is implied consent for the use of visitors' likenesses in print, online, and display materials.

WHAT TO VISIT

TERRACE CAFÉ

Enjoy a full menu of food and beverages, Wi-Fi access, views of the Art Museum's Alice Bimel Courtyard, and seating on the outdoor terrace during warm weather. Art Museum Members receive a 10% discount. The Terrace Café is open Tuesday through Sunday, 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. A limited menu is served on Thursday evenings from 3 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. Café reservations can be made by calling 513-639-2986.

MUSEUM SHOP

Stop by the Museum Shop to find treasures based on our special exhibitions and our permanent collection. The shop is open during regular visiting hours. Art Museum Members receive a 10% discount.

THE MARY R. SCHIFF LIBRARY

Our new library is open Tuesday through Friday from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. as well as the second Saturday of each month.

THE ROSENTHAL EDUCATION CENTER

Take the family to visit our new education center which is open Tuesday through Sunday 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. On Thursdays the Center is open from 11 a.m. to 8 p.m.

GENERAL POLICIES

BASIC SAFETY POLICIES Please do not touch the art or cases. No food or drink is permitted in the galleries. Children must be accompanied by an adult at all times. For the safety of children and the art, large-framed child carriers are not permitted in the galleries. Small baby slings and small child carriers are permitted, but we ask parents to be mindful of their surroundings while walking in the Art Museum.

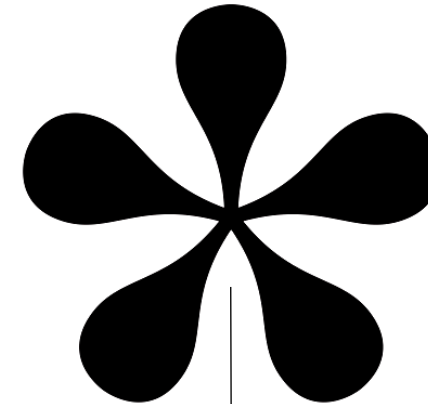
COAT ROOM All packages, briefcases, shopping bags, and items larger than 11x15 inches must be stored. The Cincinnati Art Museum is not responsible for items lost or stolen. Lockers are available. Please store umbrellas in the coat room.

WHEELCHAIRS AND STROLLERS The Art Museum provides wheelchairs and strollers free of charge, they are located in the coat rooms by each entrance.

SKETCHING Visitors are welcome to sketch and copy only items in the Art Museum's permanent collection. You can pick up a free permit at the Visitor Services Desk.

SMOKING The Art Museum prohibits smoking, this includes the use of e-cigarettes or other electronic smoking devices.

PHOTOGRAPHY If you see the No Photography icon shown, please refrain from taking photographs or recording video of the related artwork. These works are protected under US copyright law and photography violates the artist's copyright. Special Exhibitions which do not allow photography feature a sign at the entrance which states no photography is permitted. Please no flash photography. We apologize, but tripods, monopods, and or "selfie sticks" are not permitted in the Art Museum.

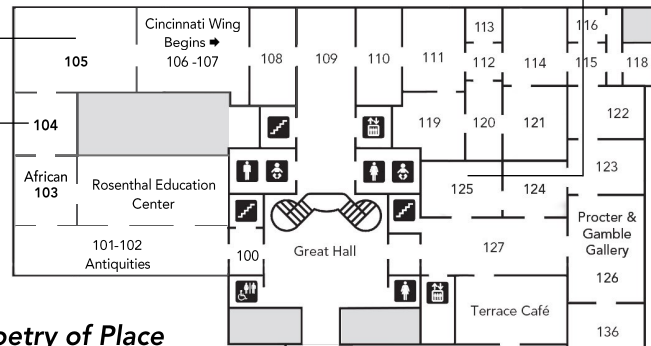

* *William Kentridge: More Sweetly Play the Dance*

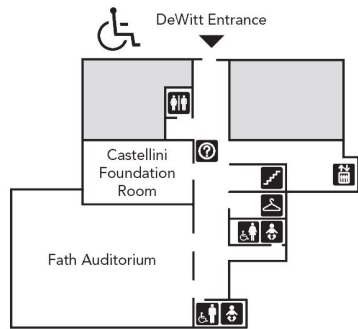

1ST FLOOR



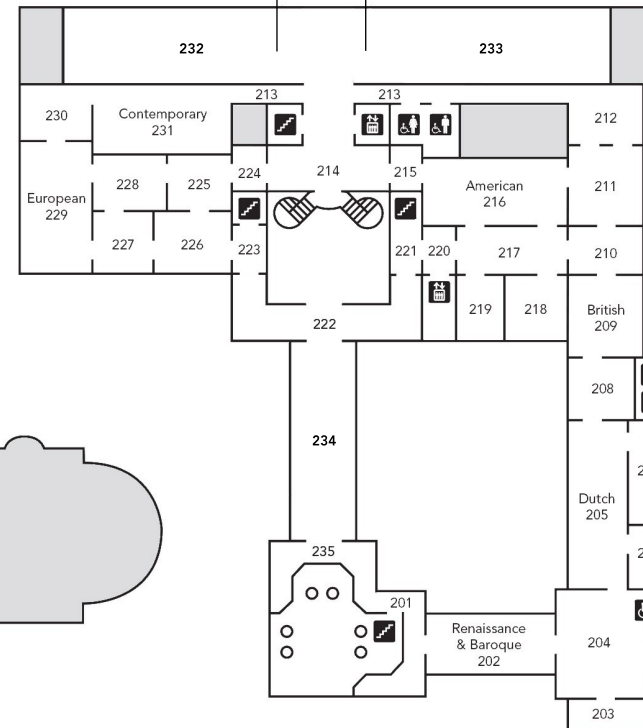

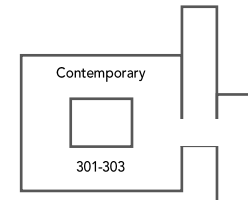
