TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 6, 2016

"DUVENECK ASSOCIATION KICKOFF PARTY"

It's a fabulous display, soon to be dismantled, so you may one to take this occasion for one more peek.

TUESDAY, OCTOBER 4, 2016 OFFSITE

"TRIP TO SPEED MUSEUM IN LOUISVILLE"

This past March, the Speed Museum re-opened after a three-year shutdown for renovations and the addition of a spectacular new wing housing post-war and contemporary art. The range of what's on display is vast and varied, featuring works by both widely celebrated artists and others lesser known. But it's all first-rate, and we're lucky to have it just a short bus ride away. It is an easy way to view an important addition to the region's inventory of exceptional art.

MONDAY, NOVEMBER 14, 2016

"VAN GOGH: INTO THE UNDERGROWTH"

This is our signature fall exhibition, in the making for many years, originally conceived by former European Art Curator Esther Bell. Built around the museum's own Van Gogh of two figures in a forest, the show will feature nine of the artist's not-so-frequently-seen paintings (each in its own way relating to ours), and 16 additional works by artists who influenced him, including Diaz de la Peña, Rousseau, Cézanne, Gauguin, Renoir and Monet. For people who love painting, it promises to be a rare treat.

"LOCAL COLLECTOR SPEAKS ABOUT HIS COLLECTION"

In recent years, the museum has organized several exhibitions of Asian art, each one impressive in scope and quite beautiful in its individual offerings. "Dressed to Kill," a display of Japanese armor and uniforms of war from its imperial past promises to be another proud entry in this line-up.
