Picnic in the Park dining options, which include **Van Gogh To-Go** (cheese and wine), **Dining with Duncanson** (lunch for two) and **Cassatt Cuisine Bites** (assorted cheese and snacks), are available from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. Tuesdays through Sundays. Explore the full
