On Saturday, May 8 from 3-4 p.m., celebrate the one-year anniversary of the Cincinnati Art Museum's Art Climb with the Cincinnati Chamber Orchestra. The free concert features musicians performing on various landings among the 164 steps, including three quartet/quintets (strings, brass and winds) and a solo cellist. While safely social distancing, visitors are encouraged to move up and down the Art Climb and enjoy brief musical works.
