An Art Bet for the Big Game





CINCINNATI— The Cincinnati Art Museum is making the showdown between the Bengals and Rams on Sunday even more exciting for art lovers with a friendly wager which creates a chance to put two beautiful artworks together in 2022, the year of the Tiger.

The Cincinnati Art Museum and the Huntington Library, Art Museum, and Botanical Gardens, a collections-based research and educational institution in Greater Los Angeles, are betting a loan of a painting from their respective permanent collections.

The winning football team's museum will receive a temporary loan of an artwork by American painter and teacher Robert Henri. Henri (pronounced Hen-rye) was born in 1865 in Cincinnati, the son of a professional gambler and real estate developer.

The two wagered works both capture Henri's straightforward approach to unconventional realist subjects executed in a bold, painterly style. Cincinnati's <u>Patience Serious</u> from 1915 is a portrait of a young girl wearing Rams blue, while The Huntington's <u>Irish Girl</u>, 1927, is wearing warmer colors, as if to honor the Bengals.

This follows a tradition of art museums wagering artwork loans during the Football Event of the Year, going back to 2010.

"Patience Serious has been waiting a long time to see her friend. After the Bengals take care of business on the football field on Sunday, she's invited to Cincinnati for a play Dey," jabbed Cameron Kitchin, Cincinnati Art Museum's Louis and Louise Dieterle Nippert Director.
